

Request for Public Comment on Proposed Substantial Amendment to Delaware's Neighborhood Stabilization Program 2 (FY 2009 Action Plan)

The State of Delaware, through the Delaware State Housing Authority (DSHA), announces with this notice the availability for public review and comment a proposed substantial amendment to the Neighborhood Stabilization Program 2 (FY 2009 Action Plan).

The Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has awarded the State of Delaware \$10,007,109 in Neighborhood Stabilization Program 2 (NSP2) funds under the Housing and Economic Recovery Act of 2009. Certain changes from the application, as awarded, require approval by HUD. The proposed changes outlined in the substantial amendment have been prepared by DSHA and will allow the State to make its NSP2 program a complete success. The proposed amendment is:

The State proposes to enlarge the target area of Kent County's NSP2 program by adding four additional Census tracts where the County may purchase, rehabilitate, and transfer foreclosed/abandoned properties for the purpose of stabilizing selected County neighborhoods. The additional Census tracts are 410, 415, 430, and 433. Three of the four Census tracts in the expanded area are contiguous to the current target area and are part of the NSP1 allowable areas. One Census tract lies outside the target area. Housing conditions in all Census tracts continue to present a need for further attention from the program.

The period for receipt of public comment on the proposed substantial amendment to the NSP shall be for 15 days from <u>December 15, 2015</u> to <u>December 30, 2015</u>. The proposed substantial amendment shall be available for public review on DSHA's website at <u>www.destatehousing.com</u> and at the following location:
